

BRITISH SKIDMORE/SCUDAMORE NOTES BY WARREN SKIDMORE MICROFILMED BY THE GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY OF UTAH IN 2005.

The 42 volumes of materials that I have collected since 1941 on the British Scudamore/Skidmore family has now been microfilmed on 10 reels by the Genealogical Society of Utah. The reels can be used at the Family History Library at Salt Lake City, or can be borrowed and used at any of the Family History Centers throughout the world. The initial charge is \$3.25 per reel. A renewal is another \$3.25, and a second renewal of \$3.25 (total \$9.75) permits the reel to remain *permanently* at the Branch Center in most cases. [Reels are not sold to individuals.] To find the center nearest to you go to www.Familysearch.org/, click on Library, and scroll down to Family History Centers.

Example 3: GSU may exchange your Materials with commercial genealogical companies so that GSU can, in return, receive new data that will increase the total volume of information GSU makes available to the public at no cost.

Example 4: GSU may digitally scan your Materials so that your Materials can be posted on the Internet and made accessible to registered genealogical researchers around the world.
